

Healthy Lunchbox Policy



At Barncroft we know how important it is that children have a healthy, balanced lunch (based on the eatwell plate). Our school dinners are a very healthy choice and the best way of ensuring your child has a good balanced meal but we know some families prefer their child to have a packed lunch. Getting ideas and inspiration for what to include in your child's lunchbox can be a difficult task. The most important thing to remember when thinking about making changes to a child's diet is that food should be enjoyable. Foods should not be classified as either good or bad. In fact any food, no matter how bad its reputation, can be included in a healthy diet as long as the overall balance of nutrients in the diet is right. Our Healthy Lunchbox policy helps to explain what this means in terms of getting a good balanced meal in a lunchbox.

These boxes go to disadvantaged children in Albania, Montenegro, Moldova and the Philippines. International Customs require items which must be for education, health and hygiene purposes. All items must be new or in as new condition.

Do not include battery powered items, war related items, guns, knives etc. large items of clothing, books of a religious, racial or political nature, food of any kind, liquids of any kind, sweets, medicines, large toys or any sharp items.

Please cover your box with wrapping paper ensuring the lid is separately wrapped for customs' purposes .

Please choose an age range and choose from the list of items,

AGE 1– 3 Choose from:

Small soft toy, picture book, hat gloves, socks, soap, hairbrush, flannel, toothbrush and toothpaste, plus any other suitable small items.

AGE 4 - 7 Choose from:

Educational book and game, simple jigsaw, ball, lego, crayons and colouring book, hat, gloves, scarf, soap, hairbrush, flannel, toothbrush and toothpaste, toy vehicle small doll, or skipping rope.

AGE 8 - 11 Choose from:

As above including felt tip pens, pencils, pencil case, comb and hair accessories.

AGE 12 - 15 Choose from:

Educational book, game, playing cards, geometry set, pencil sharpener, rubber, writing/drawing book, hat, gloves, scarf, socks, wide toothed comb, soap, flannel, toothbrush and toothpaste, wash-bag, hair accessories.
