## School Uniform Reminders

A quick reminder that shoes must be black - no trainers with coloured soles or logos e.g. Adidas or Nike. School plimsolls will be provided if your child is not wearing the correct footwear. If your child has pierced ears only one pair of stud earrings can be worn.

Children are not allowed to wear earrings for swimming or PE so they must be able to remove them for these lessons or not wear them on that day. If your child has just had their ears pierced they may wear a swim hat for the six weeks it takes to heal, earrings can be taped for PE. Children should not wear any other jewellery or coloured nail polish. Full details of our school uniform are on the website. Also, please remember to name all clothing so it can then be reunited with its owner when mislaid. We will contact parents by phone or text if your son or daughter does not comply with our uniform expectations.
