## Staying Safe

The darker days around school times are now here and we would like to remind parents and children to wear reflective or light coloured clothing and if on a bike/scooter to use lights. It is also vital that the children know where to meet parents or other adults when being picked up. We remind the children regularly that they should come back into school if they are unable to find who they are expecting to meet. As the weather gets colder, please make sure the children bring a coat to school as they can be outside in the cold over lunch for a long time and please ensure it is named.

## Important Notice

Please do not let any children or siblings play on the Trim Trail before or after school, or run onto the field and into the woodland area. There must be staff supervision for these areas to be used.

Children should not be coming onto school grounds before 8.30am, unless attending Breakfast Club which opens at 8am. They may wait in the school playgrounds from 8.30am until their class doors open at 8.45am, but there will be NO adult supervision at this time.

## Reminder - School Rules for Hair and Nails

We ask that your child should not come to school with an extreme hairstyle - no shaved patterns or Mohicans. Shaved hair styles should not have anything less than a Grade 2, long hair should always be tied back. No hair should be coloured with permanent, temporary or even spray in dyes. False nails, even temporary ones are not allowed in school and no nails are to be painted with nail varnish. The school will ask any pupil wearing nail varnish to remove it and if they refuse parents will be telephoned. Many thanks for your continued co-operation.


## Kuma Class News
