Sports Funding Report

April 2016

The Government have given every Primary School a grant to improve the provision of PE in schools. The amount of grant is dependent on the numbers and ages of children in school and we received an allocation of **£9,550 from April 2015 to March 16**, based on 338 pupils. This report for governors and interested parties shows where the money has been spent and reviews the impact on teaching and learning at Barncroft Primary. This report also demonstrates the direction and plan for future Sports Funding spending and the aims and justification behind this.
